OVERVIEW OF SUCCESSES

NEB Meetings - June 5 & 6

Whitney Punchak (NEB Socio-Economic Specialist), Brian Martin (NEB Regional Director for BC) and Dr. Keith Chaulk (new NEB Board Member) arrived in Dawson Creek on June 5th. Elvin & Judi met the group after dinner and took them on a tour of pipelines and facilities in the Rolla area. Met with a local landowner later that evening for an informal discussion of the impact of pipelines on a farmer/landowner.

On June 6th, the NEB group met at the FAO for a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the function of the office, followed by a meeting with landowners from both the north and south Peace areas.

The FAO hosted lunch for 2 Regional Directors and the NEB group.

Following lunch, the NEB group accompanied Elvin and Judi on a tour of pipelines and facilities in the Arras area. Proceeding west to the Chetwynd area, the NEB group met with landowners affected by the Wyndwood expansion project.

For the final site visit of the day, landowners showed the group a NEB regulated pipeline on their property where huge rocks have been falling onto the pipeline ROW from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure rock quarry above. Now a large amount of fill has been placed on the ROW to protect the pipeline from the falling rocks. The landowner is not happy with the situation and has been frustrated in his attempts to get his land cleaned up.

Brian Martin and Dr. Keith Chaulk expressed that they found their visit to the Dawson Creek area very beneficial, as it fits in very well with the current NEB initiative to have more direct contact with landowners.
